



## COVID-19 Safety Tips for In-Person Events

These safety tips are designed to help reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19 (coronavirus) at events open to the public. The BIA of Clark County will always follow the state and local guidelines in effect at the time of the event.

- ✓ Stay home if you are sick. DO NOT ATTEND AN EVENT.
- ✓ Face coverings should be worn by all attending the event.
- ✓ Please practice social distancing — always maintain six feet between each person.
- ✓ In-house event attendants will be limited to five. This is in accordance with state and local guidelines to help maintain the recommended six-foot separation.
- ✓ Waiting areas will be clearly marked outside for those waiting to enter the home. People waiting should also practice social distancing, maintaining six feet of separation between each person.
- ✓ One-way paths will be established to ensure social distancing is exercised.
- ✓ Homes will be frequently cleaned and disinfected throughout the day with an emphasis on frequently touched areas such as countertops, doorknobs, stair rails, and display areas.
- ✓ Bathrooms and powder rooms will not be available for use.
- ✓ All lights will be left on in the house for the duration of the event to minimize contamination.

**Please note:** The BIA of Clark County and the builders participating in the New Homes Tour are continually updating their best practices and adopting new guidance from appropriate governmental and health agencies and officials to ensure compliance with all social distancing, mitigation, and cleaning protocols. Attendees must follow the safety procedures and protocols established for the New Homes Tour including but not limited to wearing face coverings, maintaining physical distances of 6 feet from staff and other people onsite and other reasonable measures to minimize possible exposure. Despite the preventative measures we have put in place to reduce the spread of COVID-19, we cannot prevent you from becoming exposed to, contracting, or spreading COVID-19 while visiting the homes participating in the New Homes Tour. Therefore, if you choose to enter onto the premises, or into the homes, you may be exposing yourself to and/or increasing your risk of contracting or spreading COVID-19. You voluntarily assume such risk related to COVID-19 from being on the premises or entering the homes in the Tour.
